

Fast forward to March 2015: Temperatures will soon be warming, and my thoughts are turning to one of my passions, fly fishing.

When you combine all these, there is nothing like the feeling of seeing the colors of a rainbow swimming toward your fly.

My uncle lives in Montana, where I've fished the famed Blackfoot and Clark Fork Rivers. This summer, I had an incredible experience traveling to Wyoming's beautiful Wind River Range. I slept on the ground, hiked long distances and battled mosquitoes the size of small birds. It was all worth it. The Wind River Range rewarded our hardships with beautiful Brookies and Cutties, bigger than I've ever seen.

For some great fishing opportunities nearby, Bill Bartee, owner of Jesse Brown's Outdoors, recommends the Davidson near Brevard (which I've fished and is great), Cane Creek in Linville and The South Toe near Mount Mitchell. If you're interested in taking up the sport, drop by Jesse Brown's to ask about their gear and guide services.

If you've never tried fly fishing, I hope you will. Just seeing a trout hitting a fly in an explosion of colors and water will hook you for life. Plus, trout is absolutely delicious. I hope to see you on one of North Carolina's fabulous rivers. You'll recognize me immediately; I'll have a huge smile on my face!



AFTER A MASSIVE, YEAR-LONG RENOVATION, WALT AND MARGY PETTIT HAVE SETTLED INTO THEIR HOME AT 1943 QUEENS ROAD. THEY BOUGHT THE 1920s Tudor Revival House, which is listed on THE NATIONAL HISTORIC REGISTER, IN LATE 2012. The home is situated on the corner of Queens ROAD AND SHARON ROAD ACROSS FROM MYERS PARK BAPTIST CHURCH. THE PETTITS' PAINSTAKING AND THOUGHTFUL RESTORATION OF THE HOME HAS GARNERED NOTICE AND APPRECIATION FROM THE NEIGHBORHOOD, WINNING THEM THE CONNIE BROWN MYERS PARK HOMEOWNERS ASSOCIATION Preservation Award and the Historic CHARLOTTE BLAST FOR THE PAST RESIDENTIAL Award in the past year.

Margy and Walt are both native Charlotteans, and Margy is from a fourth-generation Charlotte family. Walt is an attorney at The Hutchens Firm. He received a BS in business from NC State and his law degree from Mercer University. Margy is a real estate manager for The Lofts at 7714 in Mint Hill, a retrofitted textile mill turned into commercial spaces. She has a BA in history from Belmont Abbey College and an MA in history from Providence College.

Walt and Margy met at the now defunct Bachelors and Spinsters Club in Charlotte in 1981 and were married at St. Patrick's Cathedral on Dilworth Road in 1983. Margy's great-uncle, Charlotte-born John Henry Phelan (businessman, oil producer and philanthropist), donated the funds for the church to be built in 1938 in honor of his parents, Margy's great-grandparents, Patrick and Margaret Adele Phelan. The late Phelans resided on South Tryon Street when Charlotte was just a small city.

Margy explains their journey to their current home: "Our first home was a historic condominium complex on Hawthorne Lane in the Elizabeth neighborhood and then a small 1930s bungalow on Altondale Avenue in Eastover. As our family grew, we moved to Barclay Downs and then Summerlake off of Sharon View Road. We lived in the Summerlake home, right behind Olde Providence Racquet Club, for 20 years and raised our two children there. Elizabeth and Jimmy are now grown. We are an avid tennis family and enjoy playing both at Olde Providence and Myers Park Country Club."

The Myers Park neighborhood is lucky to have such committed guardians for this landmark property. As Walt concludes, "We love all the bustling activity of our Myers Park location: the church, the university and everyone strolling by!"

WHEN NOW-LEGENDARY LANDSCAPE ARCHITECT JOHN NOLEN CREATED MYERS PARK OVER 100 YEARS AGO, IT WAS A PIONEERING EFFORT OF NEIGHBORHOOD PLANNING. HOMES AND OTHER STRUCTURES WERE BUT A PART OF THE DESIGN AND WERE INTENDED TO EXIST IN HARMONY WITH NATURE. THE RESULT IS A TREASURE WHICH BRINGS ENJOYMENT TO MANY, BOTH WITHIN AND BEYOND HER PHYSICAL BORDERS.

Chief among the concerns of the Myers Park Homeowners Association (MPHA) is the preservation of Nolen's plan in the midst of high demand for this limited resource. Knowing how easily Myers Park can be diminished by overly enthusiastic building of structures too large for their lots, we joyfully celebrate those homeowners and their designers who honor the history, neighborhood design mandates, integrity and future of this special place when building or renovating.

In 2012, MPHA renamed its annual preservation award in grateful memory of our exuberant friend, tireless MPHA

board member, gifted American Society of Interior Designers member, and lover of beauty Constance Bunting Nock Brown (1940-2012). 
From patterns to poems and encouraging quotes to Disney characters, each suitcase becomes a message of hope for its future recipient. "Even though I won't get to see

But the daunting task turned out to be effortless as we stepped off the bus in Remedios into the open arms of our Cuban brothers and sisters. They met each of us with a "Cuban hug," defined as a light embrace with a kiss on the cheek. All church members (even the little old ladies) from the Iglesia Presbyteriana Reformadia in Remedios walked the full distance from their church just to meet us at our hotel. Their astounding generosity and hospitality further revealed itself when we arrived hours later at their church to see smiling faces, more Cuban hugs and a big welcome sign. As one member of our group observed, we weren't welcomed as new friends with different economic, governmental and lingual systems. It was as if we were long-lost family members being welcomed home.

The four days spent with our brothers and sisters in Remedios saw joyful times of laughter at language difficulties, heart-racing memories of an all-age baseball game and sincere moments of

faith and love-sharing. One of my favorite memories with one of the church members was when we were saying our goodbyes on our last night together. I had spoken a few days earlier at dinner with an elderly woman about how we are all children under God. On that last night together, just before I gave her a Cuban hug, she said "Mi hija," which means, "My daughter." This loving remark reminded me how alike we all are. Although we speak different languages, live in different worlds and live completely different lives, indeed we are all children under God, and we are all family.

By the end of our time spent with our new brothers and sisters, not only had the barriers been demolished with no trace of a border, but we had also achieved our goal of building bridges. After a goodbye party, the Cuban youth invited us to come back to meet at the church later. We played a Cuban spinoff of "Truth or Dare" and laughed at teenage-humor jokes. It was

as if I were hanging out with some of my school friends on a weekend. I still exchange emails with one of my friends daily, practicing my broken Spanish and exchanging salutations of "besitos" (little kisses) and "bendiciones" (blessings).

Through our four-day experience in Remedios, we achieved Day-to-day life in Cuba is vastly different from day-to-day our goal. We broke barriers and built bridges of trust. We life here. Hopefor Heggie By Resident Reporter Cynthia Sims

NOVEMBER 19 was a special milestone for one young Myers Park resident. Heggie, age 3¹/₂, was able to celebrate one year free of seizures from a crippling disease called Dravet's Syndrome, a rare form of epilepsy. It is the most catastrophic epilepsy a child can have and can lead to severe mental retardation or even death due to a seizure or complications from a seizure.

Heggie was born a healthy, full-term baby, but at eight months he suffered his first status epilepticus seizure which changed his world and that of his parents in an instant. Heggie was placed on multiple daily medications; however, the length and severity of his seizures increased. He was helicoptered to Levine Children's Hospital three times and ventilated four times with seizures lasting as long as three hours. In March 2013, Heggie's parents made the difficult decision to move from their home in Cornelius to the heart of Myers Park, directly across from the hospital, where the doctors knew and had treated Heggie so many times before. They continued with the grueling regimen of a host of daily medications and lived in fear of the unknown of when the next seizure would strike. Heggie's mother refused even to travel more than five minutes from the hospital in case Heggie had an episode.

At their doctor's suggestion, they placed Heggie on a ketogenic diet. This diet

is like an extreme Atkins diet which requires no carbohydrates. Each meal is measured to the tenth of an ounce to ensure Heggie's body stays in ketosis. To put this in perspective, Heggie ingesting even one Goldfish cracker could put him at risk for another seizure. What happened next, Heggie's mom can only explain as a "divine miracle." Within two weeks of being placed on this strict diet, Heggie's seizures rapidly decreased-he has now been seizure-free for over a year. His alertness has returned, and his daily medications have been greatly decreased. This type of result is practically unheardof for children who suffer from Dravet's and can have up to 60 seizures a day.

The ketogenic diet presented a challenge this past Halloween. Heggie's mom dropped off letters to neighbors explaining her son's condition and inability to participate in Halloween in the traditional way. She included a Matchbox car with the letter and asked if they would give the cars, rather than candy, to Heggie when he came to trick-or-treat. The support this family received was overwhelming. Heggie's mom emotionally described the night as "a true testament to what a community should be" adding that "Myers Park rose to the occasion. It was so inspiring to see people who did not even know us to take care of us in such a kind way. We are so grateful to them for making Heggie's Halloween night so special." Heggie received over 40 cars and other gifts as well as homemade ketogenic treats various neighbors had made for him.

Heggie's mom asked that this story be a message of hope as well as heartfelt gratitude for all of the support of Myers Park, Levine Children's Hospital medical staff, family and friends. They celebrated Heggie's seizure-free year with signs of gratitude in their yard. Heggie's mom summed it up beautifully. "Everyone we have met has been so loving, accepting and compassionate while we are on this difficult journey. It is a true blessing to be a part of the wonderful community of Myers Park."



othing signals the end of winter like the first crocuses poking their heads through the last of the melting snow. Few plants are as easy to grow as the earlyblooming bulbs. The only challenge is remembering to purchase and plant the bulbs. During the excitement of the summer and fall gardening season, it's hard to imagine just how bleak the garden can look in late winter.

Following is a selection of earlyblooming bulbs. Since many of these are small in stature, they look best planted in relatively large numbers. Don't be intimidated by the thought of planting 100 or more bulbs; the tiny bulbs take just seconds to plant, especially if your soil is loose. Simply make a slice in the soil with a trowel about 4 inches deep, wiggle it to make a hole, and holding the soil back with the trowel, drop in the bulb. As you slide out the trowel, push any scattered soil back into the hole, then water the area to settle the soil.

BLUE SIBERIAN SQUILLS

Scilla is one of the earliest spring flowers to bloom. Flowering for a remarkably long time they bear clusters of bloom spikes that offer scented deep blue flowers. They are exquisite when planted under spring flowering shrubs such as forsythia, azaleas, rhododendrons, and magnolias.

Crocus

Crocus ring in the spring in a range of colors from blue to yellow to white. The bright colors are wonderful planted in masses so you can enjoy a carpet of color from a distance. In the case of crocuses, more is definitely better! And like snowdrops, crocuses will multiply each year, especially if they are planted in the very well-drained soil they prefer.

SNOW GLORIES

Sometimes called Glory of the Snow, these beauties will blanket the ground with blue in early spring. Each bulb produces multiple star-shaped, sky-blue flowers. Just 4 to 5 inches in height, they look best planted in large drifts, and will multiply rapidly. Ideal for naturalizing

on lawns in light shade or for planting in between perennials, as well as between larger spring bulbs, such as daffodils.

Grape Hyacinth

Grape hyacinths aren't true hyacinths, but instead are in the genus Muscari. However, if you look closely at these flowers, you'll see the resemblance to hyacinths in the clusters of tiny flowers atop strap-like foliage. Grape hyacinths are so eager to multiply that they can become weedy. Plant them where they can spread freely--in the lawn, under shrubs--rather than in a formal bed.

If the above flowers, with their diminutive stature and often muted colors, gently announce the arrival of spring, true hyacinths fairly yell it from the rooftops. And not only are they extravagant in appearance, they are also wonderfully fragrant. Add these to the fact that hyacinths are very easy to grow, and there's no reason not to include at least a few of these beauties in your garden. They are also excellent for forcing indoors, where you can enjoy their scent each time you pass by.



Collaborative Divorce The New Normal

Anyone who has gone through a divorce will tell you that it can be one of the most challenging experiences of your life. Statistics show that fifty percent of first marriages end in divorce while the divorce rate is even higher for second marriages. Divorce has emotional and financial implications for all parties involved. Fortunately, a collaborative method is emerging to address the complex issues surrounding divorce in a productive, informed manner that often minimizes the emotional anguish and adverse financial consequences of a lengthy divorce.

North Carolina requires couples to live apart for one year before granting a divorce. During that time, divorcing couples may seek alternative methods to resolve disputes rather than going through an expensive, litigious trial. Two traditional alternative dispute methods include mediation and arbitration. The former involves an independent third party working with the couple to negotiate a settlement allowing both parties to share in the decision making process. This process can lower legal costs while providing a greater likelihood that the parties honor the agreement. Arbitration, on the other hand, is an adversarial process where an arbitrator imposes a legally binding decision after reviewing evidence in the case. This option is helpful when disagreement results in gridlock.

Collaborative divorce is emerging as a welcome alternative to the traditional dispute resolutions outlined above. Under the guidance of their respective lawyers, divorcing couples collaborate with a team of trained professionals to resolve emotional and financial disputes respectfully outside of court. When necessary, professionals such as marriage counselors and financial specialists are brought in to advise on matters in their areas of expertise. Because of the financial complexity inherent in divorces, financial planners and tax professionals are playing



a more active role in alternative dispute resolutions. However, many of these professionals have little or no training specifically related to the complex financial issues of divorce. To best meet the financial needs of divorcing clients, the Certified Divorce Financial Analyst (CDFATM) designation was created.

A CDFATM professional typically comes from a financial planning, accounting, or legal background and goes through an intensive training program to become skilled at analyzing and providing expertise on both the short and long-term financial implications of divorce. When a CDFATM is involved early in the process, they can provide comprehensive and accurate financial information necessary to reach a workable agreement as well as explain options, help set priorities and assist with the difficult choices involved in reaching a settlement. Enlisting the help of a CDFATM professional can help all parties understand the financial implications both during and after divorce and help ensure a stable economic future for both parties while preventing long-term regret over misguided financial decisions made under the duress of divorce.


